1903

Construction facilities for pasta machines are established.



1930

First metal die-casting machine by Bühler is delivered to the A. Brizon company in Courbevoie, France.

1870

Construction of a four-roller mill with 1000 mm width. With this, Bühler proves that with sensible, simple engineering and exact construction of all parts, it can indeed be done.



1919

Start of the chocolate business with the construction of chocolate refiners. As an outcome of this, roller mills for the soap and paint industries are also developed.

Introduction of pneumatics in mill manufacturing. Transport of grain and grist via an air stream revolutionizes mill designs worldwide.



2007

With the Carat model, Bühler introduces two-platen technology into die casting.

1934

A semi-automatic extruder replaces the hydraulic press in pasta machines. This innovation steers the entire process of pasta production onto an industrial path.



1975

First computer-operated machines. For the first time ever, programmable electronic controls (a PC system) are implemented at Bühler. They will go on to replace the old relay controls.

2019

Bühler has developed technologies and capabilities to offer total rearing and processing solutions for the insect industry.



2022

Bühler unveils the next generation hammer mill, Granulex[®] 5 series. It can achieve 10% reduction in energy consumption per tonne, and in some cases up to 30%.


2015

The myBühler platform is launched as an e-shop for ordering spare parts. Since then, it has been developed into a portal providing an overview of the customer's Bühler equipment.



2021

First Mill E3, Bühler's most high-tech mill, is handed over to the customer Whitworth Bros Ltd.



MIAG, 1972

MIAG, Mühlenbau und Industrie GmbH, Braunschweig, Germany is acquired in 1972. After the acquisition, investment efforts and productivity increased dramatically.

SORTEX, 1994

In 1994 Sortex, the world's leading manufacturer of optical sorting equipment, based in London, is acquired by Bühler.

Aeroglide, 2008

Aeroglide, the market leader for drying machines and other thermal processes in the nutritional, animal feed, and industrial sectors, is acquired by Bühler in 2008.

Mergers and acquisitions that shaped the future of Bühler

Schmidt-Seeger, 2010

In 2010 Bühler acquires Schmidt-Seeger a global scale plant supplier in grain management with proven know-how in drying, storage, handling, and malting.

Leybold Optics, 2012


Leybold Optics, the world's leading provider of production systems for vacuum deposition of functional layers, is acquired in 2012.
